A few good locations to host this would be at a local park, community centre or a school's playground plenty of running room and hiding places.

GETTING THE HUNT TOGETHER:

- Get a planning committee together who can make and hide the clues. There should be enough clues made that will keep the participants busy for an hour.
- Have different starting points and paths laid out, enough for several groups of 8-12. This way not everyone will head to the same spot to hunt for clues at once. The planning committee can also help in directing the participants when the games starts, explaining clues and keeping order.
- Send out invitations via flyers announcing the time, date, location and what prizes can be won.

- Ask each team to wear a different colour.
- For school Scavenger Hunts, have parents on hand for security to keep the kids safe and first aid. Don't forget a first aid kit for scraped knees!
- Big batches of participation ribbons can be purchased at party or craft stores so everyone has a memento of the day's event.
- Assign a cleaning crew to clean up after the event. You want to leave the area clean and tidy!

This event should be fun and exciting, so build up the anticipation by talking it up. Advertise your event far and wide through posters, newsletters and social media. Make sure you let everyone know that all funds raised will be going to Telethon! Plan a sausage sizzle or bake sale after the hunt, all food and drinks purchased can add to your fundraising total. All food items can be donated to boost profits.
